


94% believe technology and innovation play an important role in addressing public health priorities, but only 30% believe authorities have done a good job ensuring everyone has access to the latest innovations in public health


93% believe consumer goods companies have an obligation to research and innovate better alternatives

Thinking about public health priorities in this country, how important of a role do you believe technology and innovation can play in addressing these issues?


Generally speaking, do you believe authorities in this country have done a good job or a poor job ensuring everyone has access to the latest innovations and advancements that can improve public health?








At least eight-out-of-ten believe adult smokers should have access to alternatives to cigarettes and information about these products
